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1.1 Overview

Keith Diaz Moore is a Professor of Architecture, Director of the new Design Institute for Health & Resilience and Associate Provost (institutional Design & Strategy) at the University of Utah, and is a member of its Center on Aging. As Associate Provost, Diaz Moore is responsible for the institution's place-making strategy on campus, and at satellite locations globally. Additionally, both the Office of Space Planning and Management and the Office of Global Engagement report to him.

In his short time as Associate Provost for Institutional Design and Strategy, role Diaz Moore has:

- Launched a strategic planning process for Global Engagement with a steering committee of a dozen campus leaders and five working groups f over 70 campus members tasked with developing a plan for Comprehensive Internationalization
- Executed a redesign of a unified process for deciding space and facility investment and allocation aligned with academic planning
- Constituted a cross-campus committee to forward best practices for International Student Success
- Constituted a cross-campus committee to envision the classroom platforms (setting, technology, service support) of the future to promote student success through various modalities
- Been appointed to the President's Strategic Planning Steering Committee

In his role as Dean, Professor Diaz Moore facilitated:

- A new College Vision with associated 4-year SMART Goals (accomplished 20 of 24) and a refresh of the vision with new 4-year SMART Goals (12 of 13)
- a college-wide curriculum transformation seeking to create the "Utah School" embodying our shared vision
- collaborations with the Marriott Library and Colleges of Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Health, Humanities, Medicine, Nursing, Social Work & the Natural History Museum of Utah
- the "Resilient Places for an Aging Society" Transforming for Excellence Initiative (Cluster hire)
 - increased annual grantsmanship 300%
- Increasing Student Support (Scholarships by 400%; Assistantships by 300%)
- A new Direct Admission program resulting in an annual growth rate of 9% and avg HS GPA increasing from 3.2 to 3.75
- Four new research/outreach centers/labs (Center for Ecological Planning and Design, the Consortium for Dark Sky Studies, Healthy Aging and Resilient Places (HARP) Lab, Transforming Places, Practices & Pedagogies Collaborative (TP₃C) and the Design Institute for Health and Resilience
- additional facilities (in the Nielsen Fieldhouse and the Business Classroom Building), classroom improvements (Rooms 127, 128, 228 and 229 and the

- Bailey Gallery) and a new student “Commons,” with a Student Success Center, a large collaborative work space, a digital fabrication lab and café
- an Inclusive Building Project adding an elevator, ramp and accessible restrooms, and acoustical renovation for the hearing impaired
 - a new Dean’s Distinguished Lecture Series
 - creation of a new faculty and staff “Ethic of Care” recognition program
 - creation of a Distinguished Alumni program
 - creation of a bi-annual Mental Health & Design National Summit

At the University of Utah, Dr. Diaz Moore has also had the privilege of serving as Interim Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs (iSVPA) and Interim Chief Sustainability Officer (iCSO). Briefly serving as iSVPA, Dr. Diaz Moore:

- started a strategic analysis of diversity efforts on campus that eventually resulted in a restructuring of EDI at the University (placing at Presidential Level)
- hired two deans
- launched efforts for the NWCCU accreditation mid-review and reclassification of the U as a Carnegie Community Engaged University
- extended family benefits to staff
- surpassed the \$500 million in external grant dollar generation for the first time for the U
- committed that all new construction going forward would be net-zero ready

As iCSO, Dr. Diaz Moore:

- led a strategic planning process for the Sustainability Office
- created an integrated leadership committee for the office involving education, research, and operations perspectives
- moved the U passed 50% of energy coming for renewables and entered an agreement to get the U to over 70% by the end of 2021
- submitted entry that eventually earned the University STARS Gold

Dr. Diaz Moore’s scholarly activities have focused on the nexus between culture, wellness and design, with a specialty in the area of environmental design for older people experiencing dementia. He has garnered over \$750,000 in research grants and has been able to engage regional leaders in healthcare design into his studios, resulting in both economic and social capital gains. His leadership in this area has been recognized in his election and service as Chair of the Environmental Design Research Association (2006) and as President of the Architectural Research Center Consortium (2011-2014). He was also elected to the USD 497 School Board of Education reflecting his community leadership and was instrumental in the passage of a \$92.5 million bond. In 2019, he served as President of AIA Utah.
