

Julie Steele, DNP, APRN, FNP-BC is an Assistant Professor (Clinical) at the University of Utah College of Nursing, faculty member with the Utah Regional Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental Disabilities (URLEND) program, and holds an adjunct faculty position within the Department of Pediatrics. She is a Duke Johnson & Johnson Nurse Leadership Fellow alumni (2015) and family nurse practitioner.
