

Kathy L. Chapman, Ph.D. received a Ph.D. in Child Language Development and Disorders from Purdue University. She began her academic career at the University of Montana and then moved to Case Western Reserve University where she served as Department Chair. Dr. Chapman is currently a Professor in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at the University of Utah. She has taught courses in language and phonological disorders in young children, cleft palate, and research methods. Her early research focused on children with specific language impairment and more recently, on language and phonological development of young children with cleft palate. She is especially interested in the impact of clefting on the developing speech sound system. Dr. Chapman has numerous data-based articles and presentations related to these areas of study. She has served on numerous editorial boards and was Associate Editor for the American Journal of Speech-Language Pathology and is currently serving as Associate Editor for Language, Speech, Hearing Services in Schools.
