

Melinda Bonnie Fagan is Associate Professor of Philosophy at the University of Utah, where she holds the Sterling McMurrin Chair. Her research focuses on experimental practice in biology (particularly stem cell and developmental biology), explanation, and philosophical conceptions of objectivity and evidence. She is the author of *Philosophy of Stem Cell Biology* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2013) and more than twenty-five articles and book chapters on topics in philosophy of science and biology. Her educational background is interdisciplinary, including Biology (B.A. 1992, Williams College; Ph.D. 1998, Stanford University), Philosophy (M.A. 2002, University of Texas at Austin), and History and Philosophy of Science (Ph.D. 2007, Indiana University). Before joining the University of Utah faculty in 2014, Fagan was Assistant Professor of Philosophy at Rice University (2007-2014) where she developed her research program and taught courses in philosophy of science, theory of knowledge and social epistemology. She is currently working on a view of explanation focused on concepts of collaboration and interaction.
