Blair Bateman holds a BA and MA in Portuguese from Brigham Young University and a Ph.D. in Second Languages and Cultures Education from the University of Minnesota. A native of Salt Lake City, he joined the faculty at the University of Utah in 2022, prior to which he worked as a professor of Spanish and Portuguese Pedagogy at Brigham Young University for 20 years. At BYU he served in various leadership positions, including associate chair of the Department of Spanish and Portuguese, co-chair of the BYU Secondary Education Committee, member of the Educator Preparation Program Executive Committee, member of the Faculty Advisory Council, and coordinator of programs in Dual Language Immersion K-12 Teaching, Portuguese Teaching, and Spanish Teaching.

Professor Bateman's teaching has encompassed a wide variety of areas, including foreign/second language teaching research and methodology, Portuguese language and Lusophone cultures, and dual language immersion teacher preparation. He has many years of experience in supervising student teachers, training and supervising graduate student instructors, and advising MA thesis committees. He was the recipient of the 2011 Benjamin Cluff Jr. Award for Excellence in Teacher Education.

Professor Bateman has published research on language teacher preparation, Portuguese teaching, immersion education, and the teaching of culture, in national and international journals including *Foreign Language Annals, The Modern Language Journal, Hispania, Portuguese Language Journal, NECTFL Review,* and the *Journal of Immersion and Content-Based Language Education*. He is the principal author of the textbook *Perspectivas: Português para Falantes de Espanhol.* 

Professor Bateman's service to the language teaching profession include 17 years on the Executive Board of the Utah Foreign Language Association, including a term as UFLA President, as well as Director of Test Development for the National Portuguese Exams.
